Themed “Inspire. Innovate. Adopt. Impact”
The Annual Peace Festival is Positive Peace Generation’s flagship initiative: a vibrant, multi-day summit integrating creative expression, civic education, technology, and hands-on community engagement to transform young people into active change agents.

Scheduled for 18–19 September 2026 at Kigezi College in Kabale District, Uganda. Organised by Positive Peace Generation in partnership with Interact RYLA Rotary District 9214, the festival brings together 3,000 young people from schools across the Kigezi and entire western region to engage in transformative programming on peacebuilding, climate action and waste management, bullying and gender-based violence pre-

vention, Leadership and behavioural development, sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), menstrual equity, mental health, and drug abuse prevention.

Building on the momentum of two highly successful previous editions, the 1st edition in Busia District (2024, 3,000+ delegates) and the 2nd edition in Bushenyi District (2025, 4,700+ delegates), this 3rd edition is the most ambitious yet. Objectives and Expected Outcome

1. Equip 3,000 youth with practical peace-building, leadership, and conflict resolution skills
2. Train and equip 40 School patrons and head teachers to act as community multipliers and immediate youth support systems at their respective schools
2. Donate 1000 sanitary pads, Increase awareness and access to critical health, SRHR, and social services
3. Support and showcase 10 youth-led innovations and community solutions solving real problem.
4. Foster multi-stakeholder partnerships across government, civil society, and the private sector
5. Amplify youth voices for collective community action and policy influence 6. Plant 3,000 trees and distribute 20 dustbins as tangible climate action legacy
6. To equip youth with practical, income-generating skills, including Liquid Soap Making, Sanitary Pads Making, Book Making, and Waste Management & Recycling for self-reliance and lasting community impact



PROGRAMME COMPONENTS & METHODOLOGY

Youth-Led Peace-building Mentor- ship.

Structured conflict identification and solution design workshops; peer-to-peer learning through role-plays and simulations; and personal or group action plan development with mentorship support.

Beyond the classroom, participants will gain hands-on practical skills for self-reliance and community impact including Liquid Soap Making, Sanitary Pad Making, Book Making, and Waste Management & Recycling.
